In Sacred Reckonings with the Doctrine of Discovery's Betrayal: What Queerness Teaches Us About Strategies of Resistance, Embodied Joy, and Acts of Reparation Rev. Dr. Voelkel will reflect on the betrayals wrought by the Doctrine of Discovery and its triplet offspring of White Supremacy, Christian Supremacy, and Extractive Capitalism. She will also explore how queerness, and, in particular, queer theology can be a source of luscious resistance, embodied joy, and palpable acts of reparation.

"In my state of Michigan the Hamtramck City Council unanimously voted to approve a resolution that restricts the city from flying any 'religious, ethnic, racial, political, or sexual orientation group flags' on public grounds.

It is not lost on the LGBTQ+ community that this resolution came at the time that many surrounding communities chose to fly the Pride Flag. While this City Council may think that they can hide behind its list of prohibited categories, the LGBTQ+ community knows that this act was aimed at us."

with Rev. Jakob Hero Shaw


